We know that Education is key to a better understanding of HIV; understanding its impact on individuals, understanding the stigma and prejudice that can be encountered, and understanding the importance of testing and early diagnosis. That is why, in the United Kingdom we are launching the next phase of our ACT Now campaign. Are You Positive?, our education through theatre programme, will begin touring schools in the UK from the end of this month, aiming to inform and educate young people about the virus and its impact.

All of the work we do is only made possible by the continued support and commitment of all the wonderful people from the theatre industry who give so generously of their time, energy and creativity. So to everyone who has helped to make this evening possible we would like to say a massive thank you.






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




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
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
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
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IGHTING HIV&AIDS ONE STAGE AT A TIME

The Make A Difference Trust, trading as TheatreMAD, and also known as MAD Trust, is the theatre industry's response to HIV and AIDS.

Established in 1990 as West End Cares, a group of volunteers staged Late Night Cabarets, Midnight Matinee performances of West End shows, and initiated the annual World AIDS Day Theatre Bucket Collections to raise funds to support friends and colleagues affected by HIV and AIDS. The impact on the industry, as with the wider community, was devastating, primarily paying for palliative care and funerals.

With years of research and the development and advancement of effective medications, HIV and AIDS is considered by many to no longer be an issue. However, rising rates of infection and continued stigma, prejudice, discrimmination and fear mean that the need for your support and our work has never been greater.

Today as a fundraising and grant making organisation, the Trust is building on a legacy of 25 years to raise funds for HIV and AIDS projects that build awareness; deliver education about the virus, its impact and how to prevent its transmission; encourage early testing, and provide care and support to those affected by HIV, both in the UK and Sub-Saharan Africa.

The Trust works with established partners to ensure projects have maximum impact and are sustainable. The Trust has distributed over £1.6 million in grants to support individuals experiencing hardship across the UK, as well as over £1million to support projects with their UK and international partners.

HOW DO WE MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

In the UK



Are You Positive? is a 30 minute HIV theatre in education play based on 3 real life stories written by Professor Larry Heimgartner, followed by a sexual health workshop. It is aimed at key stage 4 upwards and is designed to challenge common stigmas associated with HIV, and to provide the knowledge and tools for children to protect themsleves against the virus in the future. A service delivered by MAD Trust.

Eating Together At Weekends is a communal lunch service and reduce the isolation experienced by people living with HIV the fo in London, by bringing them together over a hot nutritious meal and some good conversation at weekends.





The HIV Peer Educators Project is a beneficiary led programme aiming to empower and equip 20 African men and women living HIV in South London with skills and tools necessary to reach out and support other newly HIV diagnosed and vulnerable peers through mentorship, information, advice guidance.

Living Proof Weekend Retreats provide a safe, relaxed place to meet other people who have also been living with HIV and AIDS for five or more years. The weekend aims to reduce isolation, offer social networking, peer support and the exchange of peer led information and coping strategies.







The case for HIV Support Services Project is focused on developing an agreed minimum pathway for non-clinical HIV support services. These support services are designed to meet a range of psychological needs of people living with HIV in the UK.

The Mamohato Network Clubs and Camps Programme works with thousands of children living with HIV every year. Often these children are particularly vulnerable as they are isolated and

rejected due to their status, and receive little support from their families and communities. Often one or more of their parents has died of AIDS. By providing these vulnerable children with both education and psychosocial support, Sentebale aims to play its part in reducing the HIV rate in Lesotho, and reducing the number of adolescents dying from AIDS related illnesses.

The Neema Rescue Centre is part of Little Rock School in Kibera, Kenya, and provides a home for 20 children who have been orphaned by AIDS/HIV. The children attend the school on a daily basis where they receive food and learn to read and write. This in



turn prevents them from living in extreme poverty and improves their life opportunities and chances for gaining employment by providing them with an education.



The After Schools Programme in Port Elizabeth, South Africa has funded over 14,000 children, orphaned due to AIDS. The Programme is designed to support gifted children with their EDUCATION FUND education, as well as providing counselling and other practical

























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Need help packing? 7 Questions with Bianca Del Rio

Your performance at this year's Broadway Bares was a triumph! A very big thank you for joining us here at West End Bares

I'm excited! I'm excited to be here, I had a great time doing the Bares here in the States - I've done it twice now so I'm excited to join the London show.

You've made a massive impression in the UK since winning Ru Paul's Drag Race - are you met with the same support you've had back home?

Well you know what's interesting, I've seen so many drag queens across the United States, Australia and the UK and everyone has been so supportive. I always say the only difference between us is 3 drinks; once we've had 3 drinks we're all the same! And that's so true of London, there are people I adore. It's astounding how the television show, and I know it sounds pretty corny (especially coming from me!), but it is pretty interesting how the television show kind of makes it ok. Everyone's accepting and it's changed my life in such a good way that I really didn't expect. Getting through to the show is one thing and winning is another thing, and just being accepted and getting to travel the road is unreal.

Are you in on any Drag Race UK gossip?

I'm all for it. I'm surprised here in the United States a rival hasn't tried to create a rival show; there's really no other show like it. So I think a UK show would be amazing. Of course Ru and everyone at World Of Wonder want to make it happen so it'd be genius to open up doors for some of the brilliant drag queens here.



Despite your fabulous 'Rolodex of Hate', you broke the mould on RPDR by helping the other queens much more than previous contestants. Do the drag community support each behind the scenes or does the shade carry on?

The weird thing is that for many years I have been my persona onstage and that's all people knew of me - they would see me as Bianca and would see me as a bitch or rude and that was fine you know, I accept it because I put it out there! But nobody was aware of how I was as a person. So when you get onto a television program and they're literally filming you all day, 12 or 14 hours of footage, you can't act that good that long so if I was done early, I'd help someone. With each day it was challenging because you didn't know what the judges were going to like but you know, if they were going to send me home they would've sent me home and at least I would've gone having done the right thing.

You've been involved with theatre for a long time with your work in costume. What do you love most about the theatre community?

It was at high school, it was basically an outlet. I was never a sports fan so that wasn't going to work out for me so going I went into theatre. Costume, wigs, the ballet and opera (I did costume for them) and then hair and make up and so over the years it just evolved into drag - it just became the perfect fit. And all those years of doing that which has been my passion, definitely helped me on the show. I do miss the creative side, I don't have as much time anymore but it's still there, I'll go back to it at some point.

What do you think about some of the younger generation of drag queens and gay men who perhaps don't know the history of the Pride movement/gay culture?

I grew up in a time when AIDS was at the height of the crisis and it was a big scare when I was growing up as far as the repercussions of people living with the virus and didn't know they had it. I mean, I knew people that died of it and now we live in a world with medication thank god, that helps people and keeps people alive, and I think maybe that's where it gets blurred with younger people is that they don't see the horrendous things we saw so might think "oh well it's ok I can have unprotected sex and take this pill and this is going to work" and sure that might work but its like anything - you should trace it back to where it started and find out everything. I feel that way with AIDS and gay culture as much as I feel about sequined fabric. It's about finding out and having the knowledge of our history, which is pretty amazing. And with all the resources we have today it's all there for the taking - do your research!

Any advice for any would-be Drag Racers in the audience tonight?

Find what works for you. Not everybody's a dancer, not everybody's the best lip sync artist, not everybody's a comedian, not everybody's a seamstress... So you gotta find what works for you.

Finally, if you could take 3 people with you on a private jet to anywhere in the world, who would you take and where would you go?

So I can take 3 people? Oh god! Ok well I'd have to bring my assistant Jamie because he puts up with me so I'd have to take him (only because he's been good to me) and then I'd take Adore Delano and Courtney Act because we've been travelling a lot and have a great time together. We had the most fun in Paris so I'd definitely take those 3 to Paris - I'll hold you to it! Us Americans are fascinated by anything European and we really can't go to Australia with Courtney, we've done that already.

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
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
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
