

In April we gave our first ever theatre industry grant to The Theatrical Guild at a fantastic event hosted by Elaine Paige O.B.E., in May we celebrated our third and most successful ever *West End Eurovision*, with guest judge Graham Norton, and this December sees the seventh production of *A West End Christmas*, which you can see more about in the programme.

A vital part of the charity is our link with the Broadway community, and in particular the very special relationship that we have with our friends at Broadway Cares / Equity Fights AIDS, who continue to provide us our inspiration and our aspiration. With their and with Jerry Mitchell's incredible support, we are thrilled to be able to bring to the UK a small taste of the now legendary *Broadway Bares*, which has been running for a record-breaking 20 years, to date raising over \$7.5million for Broadway Cares / Equity Fights AIDS.

A MESSAGE FROM JERRY MITCHELL (EXECUTIVE PRODUCER)


My First trip to London to work in the West End was to assist Michael Bennett in a new musical called *Chess*. I remember that trip like it was yesterday. When Michael pulled out of *Chess* I returned with Bob Avian as Assistant Choreographer for *Follies*. Again it was a thrilling experience to work with some fantastic folks here in the West End. Little did I know a few years later I would dance again on Broadway in the Will Rogers Follies. By now I had lost many friends and colleges including Michael Bennett to AIDS. In *Will Rogers* I danced nearly naked on a drum in the opening number. My dressing room mate suggested I go to Splash, a gay bar in NYC and dance on the bar in that costume to help raise money for Broadway Cares / Equity Fights AIDS. I called six other guys and put on a show. *Broadway Bares* was born. The line outside was so long we had to do two shows, and we ended up making \$8,000.

This year we celebrated the twentieth *Broadway Bares* and set a goal to raise \$1 million. We did it, beating our target by \$16! Lets face it, sex sells. But what makes this show so sexy is that it is being done with a great deal of heart from folks who know how to give! And there is nothing hotter than watching a real dancer strip! In twenty years *Broadway Bares* has raised over \$7.5 million for Broadway Cares / Equity Fights AIDS.

Now that I have had the great good fortune to meet so many wonderful people here in the UK with my productions of *Hairspray*, *Love Never Dies* and *Legally Blonde*, I thought why not do a *Bares* here!!! I spoke with Darren, my UK 'Kiki' in *Legally Blonde* and he took the bate. So hopefully this will begin a tradition that can not only raise some serious money for The Make A Difference Trust, but like *Boadway Bares* raise the community to that caring place that makes us all feel so good. What we do together can make a difference.







John Barrowman is an Entertainer with a capital E. Voted number 3 in Broadcast Magazine's Hot 100 Talent, he sings, he dances, he acts, he presents, he judges - he is a unique talent in the British entertainment industry John has recently completed filming the guest role of Patrick Logan in the current season of *Desperate Housewives* in L.A. which was screened in the UK in June.

Having created the role of Captain Jack Harkness in the first series of Russell T Davies's revamped *Doctor Who* for BBC TV, the character created such an impact that he was given his own spin off series, *Torchwood*. Series 3 aired in 2009 on BBC1 and BBC America and series 4 will begin filming in 2011 as a co-production with Starz Network in the USA to be filmed in the USA and broadcast on BBC1 and Starz.

John's multi talents have recently been seen on primetime Saturday night, presenting his own show *Tonight's The Night* on BBC1. The show, which helped ordinary people to fulfil their performing dreams, was a co production with John's production company, Barrowman Barker Productions. The second series of *Tonight's The Night* aired this summer on BBC 1.

He has previously been a judge on the award winning talent shows for BBC1 – How Do You Solve A Problem Like Maria?, Any Dream Will Do and I'd Do Anything. He hosted the family game show The Kids Are All Right on BBC1, was a celebrity contestant on the first series of ITV's Dancing On Ice, and was the subject of a BBC1 documentary entitled The Making of Me, investigating the science of homosexuality and travelled across the USA with Mylene Klass for Children in Need in Around the World in 80 Days for BBC1.

In November 2007 John's solo album *Another Side* was released by Sony Music and went Gold. In November 2008 Sony's Epic label released *Music Music Music*. In January 2008 his autobiography *Anything Goes*, which he wrote with his sister Carole E. Barrowman, was published by Michael O'Mara Books and reached number 2 in the Sunday Times best seller's list, remaining in the top ten for 13 weeks.

A follow up autobiography *I Am What I Am* was published in October 2009. John's new album *John Barrowman* was released in March 2010 and entered the UK Album charts at number 11. John undertook a sell out solo UK concert tour in April 2008. In May 2009 he undertook a second UK concert tour, culminating in one night at the Royal Albert Hall. A Live DVD of his concert tour has been released and went straight into the music DVD charts at number 2. John will be touring the UK again in October 2010.

Born in Glasgow, where he spent his early years, John moved with his family to the United States. Whilst studying back in the UK in 1989, he landed his first professional role, starring as Billy Crocker opposite Elaine Paige in the Cole Porter musical Anything Goes at the Prince Edward Theatre. This catapulted John into a career as a leading man in musical theatre, with further West End credits including Matador at the Queen's Theatre, Chris in Miss Saigon at Drury Lane, Raoul in The Phantom Of The Opera at Her Majesty's, The Beast in Beauty And The Beast at the Dominion, The Fix at the Donmar Warehouse (for which John received an Olivier Award nomination as Best Actor in a Musical), Claude in Hair at the Old Vic, and Joe Gillis in Sunset Boulevard at the Adelphi, playing opposite both Betty Buckley and Elaine Paige. He subsequently reprised the role on Broadway, where he also starred opposite Carol Burnett in the Stephen Sondheim revue Putting It Together. After a very successful run as Bobby in Stephen Sondheim's Company at the Kennedy Center in Washington DC, John returned to London theatre in a hugely successful revival of Anything Goes, directed by Trevor Nunn at the National Theatre, which subsequently transferred to Drury Lane. He played Billy Flynn in Chicago at the Adelphi, before making his West End straight play debut, playing opposite Rob Lowe in A Few Good Men at the Theatre Royal Haymarket. John completed an 11 week run, playing Albin in La Cage Aux Folles at the Playhouse Theatre in 2009. He made his pantomime debut as Prince Charming in Cinderella at the Wimbledon Theatre and the following year he played a sell out run in the title role in Jack and the Beanstalk at the New Theatre, Cardiff. In 2007/8 he played the title role of Aladdin at the Birmingham Hippodrome, breaking all box office records, returning for the 2008/9 season in the title role of Robin Hood, breaking all box office records again! In 2009/10 he was back in Cardiff as Robin Hood. In 2010/11 he will be starring in Aladdin at the

John's movie roles include playing the Lead Tenor in the movie of the Mel Brooks musical *The Producers* and he played the role of Jack opposite Kevin Kline in *De-Lovely*. He was a regular on American television, playing Peter Williams in the Aaron Spelling series *Titans* for NBC and starred in Darren Star's *Central Park West* for CBS.

GEORGE STILES & ANTHONY DREWE MUSIC & LYRICS

Stiles and Drewe's musicals are: Just So, Tutankhamun, Honk!, Peter Pan, and the new songs for the Cameron Mackintosh/Disney production of Mary Poppins. Their new musical, Betty Blue Eyes, (based on Alan Bennett's screenplay of the film, A Private Function) will be produced by Cameron Mackintosh in early 2011. They have two other new shows in development, Soapdish and Soho Cinders. Honk! has received over 4,000 productions and has been seen around the world by over 6 million people. Mary Poppins is playing on Broadway, in Amsterdam, Helsinki and Copenhagen, is touring the USA and has just opened in Melbourne to rave reviews. In 2008 they celebrated 25 years of writing together with a sell-out concert at Her Majesty's Theatre, which resulted in a live CD, A Spoonful of Stiles & Drewe.

George's musicals with lyricist Paul Leigh are: *Moll Flanders*, *The Three Musketeers*, and *Tom Jones. The Three Musketeers* will receive its' UK premiere at the Rose Theatre, Kingston this November. His other work includes the music for Sam Mendes' *Twelfth Night* and *Uncle Vanya*, and he was Dame Edna Everage's composer and Musical Director for a blissful year in 1995.

Anthony's other musicals are: The Card (with composer Tony Hatch) and A Twist of Fate (with composer Dick Lee). As a director, his work includes Snoopy, Honkl, Just So, and The Thing About Men. It's occasionally possible to catch Anthony on stage; such international treats include his performances in Rogues to Riches, The Three Musketeers and A Twist of Fate.

Stiles and Drewe's awards include: The 2000 Laurence Olivier Award for Best New Musical (Honk!), the Eliot Norton Award for Outstanding Musical Production (Honk!), three of the top prizes at the 1996 Musical of the Year Awards for Peter Pan and The Three Musketeers, the 1995 TMA Best Musical Award (Moll Flanders), The Straits Times Award for Best Musical (A Twist of Fate), and the first ever Vivian Ellis Prize (Just So). Pete has been involved in music for almost 20 years as a producer, writer, remixer and multi-instrumentalist. Classically trained at Christ Church College in Canterbury, he spent the early years of his career writing dance music for various record labels including Sony, Universal, WEA and Plastic Fantastic.

He recorded tracks as Triptonic, Hush, Kartelle, Attica and Shenko, honing his dancefloor credentials, while also touring extensively as a drummer/percussionist with numerous bands playing everything from jazz and showtunes, to rock and drum & bass. He has helped develop artists for companies such as Warner Chappell Publishing, Global Talent and The Dairy. He was also employed as a sound designer for Zenhiser and a keyboard programmer for Yamaha Kemble. In 2001, Pete established production company bluescreen, writing TV, film and ad music, as well as producing remixes for Polydor, Concept and One Little Indian.

Classical training has enabled him to work as a scorer and arranger, writing original scores for theatre productions in the UK and America (Battersea Arts Centre, Studio Theatre Washington DC). Other theatre credits include arranging Bill Kenwright's Stepping Out and producing Stephen Clark's musical X.


